### DEQ Adopts UPMRA Suggestion for new UST Rules

Utah's DEQ asked Underground Storage Tank (UST) owners in Utah to submit comments on proposed changes to UST Rules that are needed to bring State law into compliance with the new Federal Regulations, issued October 2015.

UPMRA made a recommendation to the UST Task Force, asking DEQ to include language in the proposed new UST Rules (R311) that would allow tank owners

and operators to conduct their own hydrostatic tests on spill prevention equipment, which has required a certified tester. Testing Sump pumps and Spill Buckets is now required every three years, starting in 2018.

The DEQ agreed, and is taking the revised, proposed UST Rules to the new **Waste Management & Radiation Control Board** in September, which will begin the formal public comment period for rulemaking. DEQ hopes to have the new rules finalized by December 2016.

### **Credit Card Skimmers Multiple**

State Executives from across the country have been doing some group research on credit card skimmers. Skimming has become a multi-million-dollar industry, with virtually undetectable skimmers being found on gas pumps throughout the country, and not just in high traffic areas, or just off the Interstate. Even small towns and rural communities are being targeted. There are some **simple precautions owners**

**can take, such as using security tape and installing new locks to help prevent skimmers from being installed on their pumps.**

**Card Fraud (debit, credit and prepaid) Effects Thirty percent of Consumers Globally!** Mexico leads as the top country experiencing the most card fraud at 56%, followed by Brazil at 49% and the **U.S. at 47%**. The U.S. is in the top three due in part to being a laggard in the roll-out of EMV chip cards, with skimming and data breaches also security challenges. There were 2,260 confirmed data breaches in 2015.
