Regulatory Review: Issues to Watch this Summer

IPM&CSA is engaged in two agency rulemakings and have coordinated member calls to prepare. Thanks to participating member companies for their technical support through this process. 2015 Rules will go before the 2017 legislative session.

DEQ UST Rulemaking

IPM&CSA members are participating in DEQ's negotiated rulemaking to implement UST fees and EPA's new federal UST regulations. We supported S1244 and worked with DEQ to ensure that UST fees were capped at \$100 per tank and that the program includes adequate sideboards to protect the industry. We believe the industry is better served by a state-run program rather than by the EPA. We will continue to work closely with the agency to ensure that the program provides adequate flexibility and promotes compliance rather than punishment. Tax Commission – Distributor Fuel Tax Reports

The Idaho Tax Commission is revising Rule 130, Distributor's Fuel Tax Reports. IPM&CSA stays in touch with Tax Commission representatives to review these rules and provide feedback. The 2016 rulemaking is housekeeping in nature, with changes that eliminate outdated language and reorganize existing language. We will keep members posted on any significant changes in these rules.

It's a Wrap: The 2016 Legislative Session in Review

IPM&CSA Legislative Victories - Large and Small!

What Happened? -- These bills passed in 2016

- H463 – Minimum Wage Pre-Emption
- H372 – Auxiliary Containers
- H487 – Non-Compete Agreements, Key Employee
- H454 – Damage Prevention Board “Dig Bill” – enhanced penalties for digging without calling
- S1244 – DEQ / Underground Storage Tank Fees
- S1229 – Heavy Trucks
- HJR 5 – Legislative Review of Administrative Rules / Constitutional Amendment

What Didn't: These bills were proposed but did not pass in 2016.

- H498 Electronic Cigarettes, sale permits
- H517 / S 1357 Gaming Agency/ Bingo and Raffles
- H400 – Minimum Wage – increase minimum wage levels above federal rate in stages.
- S1310 – Dyed Diesel Enforcement
- H380 / H633 – Income Tax Rate Reduction (in combination with grocery tax credit / Nexus)
