AB 32	Taxation Committee	Revises provisions relating to special fuels. (BDR 32-382)		Support	ATAX heard 2/2 Significant DMV fiscal note -No hearing scheduled
AB 77	Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Mining Committee	Makes various changes relating to the regulation of agriculture. (BDR 49-346)	Heard	Oppose	2/19/15 NATRAM. This is a AGRI bill with language which forces fees on all POS systems and cash registered. We opposed the bill along with the Reno chamber and the retail association, but to little affect. Looks like this will have to be fought in another hearing, or in regulations. No Action no hearings scheduled
AB 83	Taxation Committee	Revises provisions relating to tobacco. (BDR 32-175)	Amend, and do pass as amended	Support	2/26 heard in ATAX Roll Your Own (RYO) Further restricts who can manufacture RYO - No Action Taken
SB 21	Revenue and Economic Development Committee	Revises provisions relating to certain taxes imposed on special fuels. (BDR 32-381)	Do pass	Support	2/12/15 Sen. Rev and Dev. This bill allows for IFTA refund with limited reporting by members. 2/12 SRevenue Passed 2/18 Pass Full Senate to Assembly 3/3 ATAX 1:30 3/3/15 As. Committee on Rev. Was heard, no opposition truckers supported.
SB 22	Revenue and Economic Development Committee	Revises provisions relating to certain licenses pertaining to intoxicating liquor. (BDR 32-455)	Heard	Neutral	2/12 SREV DO PASS. This bill gives the power to cities to handle liquor licenses, takes away power from the county and gives back to the local governments but only for craft distilleries, wineries, NOT C-Stores - not charge there Full Senate 2/18 -PASSED to ATAX 3/3 Hearing 3/3/15 As. Rev. Was heard, with support by the cities, the counties are neutral and no opposition.
SB 79	Revenue and Economic Development Committee	Provides for the regulation and taxation of liquid nicotine. (BDR 32-307)	Heard, No Action	Neutral	2/12 - STax - DOT bill seek to make liquid nicotine and OTP and taxed at the 30% of the Wholesale cost. Support RAN and Washoe/Sparks Indian Colony. Opposed - Vape Association -Brian Bederio - tax as OTP or Cig rate. Hardy 50% of wholesale...Frado, RJR, Open verse closed system - NC 45 and 40 cents from combustibles depended on risk, Sam, Altria -Mark 10 - Ford what should the rate by? NC as an example of that rate...This bill appears DEAD
SB 89	Natural Resources Committee	Revises provisions regarding expenditures from the Fund for Cleaning Up Discharges of Petroleum. (BDR 51-370)	Heard, No Action	Support	2/18 Heard No Action-Expands coverage of the Petro Fund to include PERC and other chemicals
