STOP THE GOVERNMENT BAN ON GASOLINE & DIESEL VEHICLES

The House of Representatives is considering a vote on three important pieces of legislation. We need members and supporters from our industry to help ensure they come up for a vote by contacting our members of Congress. Here's more about the legislation:

- H.R. 4468, The Choice in Automobile Retail Sales Act would stop EPA's recent proposal to require roughly 70% of new
 car and truck sales to be "zero tailpipe emission" in less than 10 years. EPA's proposal, which ignores every category
 of emissions except for tailpipe emissions, is a de facto ban on liquid-fuel-powered cars and trucks and, by extension,
 the American-made fuels they run on.
- H.R. 1435, The Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act would stop EPA from giving California the green light to
 enact its ban on gas and diesel vehicles. California, and the roughly 20 states that copy California, cannot ban vehicles
 and fuels or mandate the electrification of semi-trucks, for instance, without EPA permission. This policy makes clear
 that EPA can't grant that permission if it's going to be used to ban or restrict liquid-fuel-powered vehicles.
- H.R. 4469, The No Fuel Credits for Batteries Act makes clear that EPA does not have the authority to add an electric
 vehicle provision to the RFS, a long-standing liquid fuel policy meant to support U.S. energy security and Americangrown biofuels. Any decision to expand or redirect the RFS in this way needs to come from Congress.

INSIDE THE BELTWAY UPDATE

The fiscal year ends in 22 days, and, at this point, there has been no discussion about any sort of Continuing Resolution (CR) to address the myriad federal authorizations that will terminate at midnight on September 30. The Senate returned September 5; the House returns on September 12. As a result, Congress is only going to have 12 in-session days to draft and avert a government shut down on October 1. Still, with Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) and House Speaker Kevin McCarthy (R-CA) agreeing that a CR is necessary, a "clean" CR is not a sure thing, as the House Republican caucus and the Speaker have a few lawmakers that will make this process more difficult for the Speaker. This group, the House Freedom Caucus, has already indicated they would not be supportive of a "clean" CR, instead desiring significant cuts and policy riders that Senate Democrats will not support in a million years.

As such, it is our belief that a government shut down gets more likely by the day. In fact, some lawmakers have indicated they don't think the FY 2024 appropriations process will be completed at all, given the automatic Continuing Resolution that was part of President Biden and Speaker McCarthy's budget deal, passed earlier this year. That CR would automatically fund the government at 99 percent of current funding levels for all government programs if all 12 appropriations bills are not signed into law by January 1, 2024.

Senate Majority Leader Schumer has pointed out that each of his chamber's appropriations bills have been approved by committee on a bipartisan basis and that he will bring them to the Senate floor this month. This is in stark contrast to the legislation in the House, where significant spending cuts and policy riders driven largely by far-right members of the House Republican caucus have made each bill fiercely partisan. In fact, some are so partisan, they cannot necessarily secure enough votes from within the Republican caucus to pass. As a result, to date, the House has passed only one of its 12 spending bills – Military Construction and Veterans Affairs. One area where there is agreement, however, is in eliminating funding for the East Coast's gasoline reserve, which holds 1 million gallons of fuel in case of an emergency, like Hurricane Sandy, which is what initially spurred the program. Since language to repeal this program was included by the House and Senate, whenever FY 2024 appropriations are ultimately resolved, it is likely this provision will become law. EMA is opposing this change and arguing for additional funding for the Northeast Home Heating Oil Reserve's (NEHHOR) storage capacity from one million to two million barrels. Both of these emergency reserves were created to buy time for industry to respond to supply disruptions which fuel state and local governments, hospitals and first responders after disaster strikes.

Separately, late last week, the House Energy and Commerce Committee sent <u>a letter</u> to Ford regarding its partnership with Contemporary Amperex Technology Co., a Chinese-owned manufacturer with which it intends to invest in a Michigan-based battery plant for its EV production. The committee is interested to "learn more about whether this partnership, and others like it, will potentially exacerbate our reliance on China." They noted further that "[s]hould China gain control of domestic electric vehicle production, the United States would be exposed to serious national security risks at a time of escalating geopolitical tensions."

Finally, while Congress is still grinding back to capacity before a very busy September, the White House is still quite active, with the Administration announcing yesterday that it would block drilling in 10.6 million acres of land in Alaska – about the size of Switzerland. This includes canceling many contracts approved by the Trump Administration.

The House returns to action next week, and with that, we expect to get a clearer picture of what may (or may not) be feasibly accomplished this fall. Regardless, we look forward to keeping you updated as we learn more.

POTENTIAL FDA BAN ON MENTHOL CIGARETTES AND FLAVORED CIGARS WILL LEAD TO ILLICIT SALES IN THE MARKETPLACE

Recently, the Energy Marketers of America (EMA), along with other trade groups, sent a letter to the FDA regarding its potential product standard regulations for menthol cigarettes and flavored cigars that are expected to be finalized soon. The letter

reiterated that prohibiting menthol cigarettes and flavored cigars will increase the illicit trade of these tobacco products and negatively impact the retailers that sell them.

EMA member companies' market large volumes of cigarettes and other tobacco products at convenience stores throughout the Nation and at kiosks located adjacent to the pumps at their gasoline service stations. The sale of tobacco products is an important component of their businesses, and their interests align with those of FDA in promoting protective measures aimed at eliminating unlawful sales to minors. The vast majority of these energy marketers qualify as small businesses under U.S. Small Business Administration size categories for both wholesale and retail entities.

"Retailers are extraordinarily attuned to their customers' evolving preferences and demands. Consumers do not buy products because retailers sell them; retailers sell products because consumers buy them. The menthol cigarette market, for instance, represents 37 percent of all retail cigarette sales in the and is comprised of 18.6 million adult consumers. An estimated 8.6 million adults smoke cigars. A ban on the legal sale of all menthol cigarettes and flavored cigars will move these popular products out of the regulated system and lead to illicit markets selling these products without any government oversight," the letter said.

THIRTY PERCENT OF HAZMAT COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES INSPECTED ISSUED VIOLATIONS DURING NATIONWIDE ROADSIDE INSPECTION BLITZ

Inspectors in the U.S. conducted 6,123 commercial motor vehicle inspections to those transporting hazardous materials (HM) during the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance's (CVSA) annual five-day unannounced roadside inspection and enforcement initiative conducted June 12 -16. Those inspections included 2,658 non-bulk packages, 3,256 cargo tank vehicles and 808 other bulk HM packagings. Inspectors identified 2,096 HM violations, of which 538 resulted in out-of-service orders (OOS).

Inspecting vehicles transporting HM is a complex and detailed process that involves inspection of both vehicles and drivers. Roadside Inspectors look for violations involving vehicle equipment, driver compliance with medical and CDL licensing requirements and compliance with shipping paper, placarding, marking, labeling, packaging and loading regulations. Vehicles and drivers subject to an OOS are taken immediately out of service at the inspection site. As a result, vehicles with an OOS must be towed away from the inspection site while drivers subject to an OOS must be replaced immediately before the vehicle is moved. Vehicles and/or drivers subject to OOS are removed from service until violations are corrected. Vehicles that passed the roadside North American Standard Level I Inspection without any critical violations received a CVSA decal and permitted to continue to their destination. The following table contains a list of all OOS violations including violations that did not result in an out-of-service order:
